- 1. Minutes from 12/6/2023 unanimously approved.
- 2. 100-Acre Wood Updates
- a. Transfer to KLT is moving forward, Leslie and Ken met with Theresa Kerchner and Howard Lake in December to discuss next steps
- b. Ken has created a list, attached to these minutes, for which issues need to be in the deed or an agreement outside the deed.

Ken moved that the Conservation Commission endorse this document, dated 1/3/2024, as a list of issues we need agreement, whether in the deed or a side agreement, with Kennebec Land Trust to transfer the land. UNANIMOUS

- 3. Survey at 100-Acre Wood update
- a. Parking lot pins have been place
- b. Still to be completed, blazing of new line between Lane and The Wood and map updates. Due late January early February.
 - 4. Trail update
- a. After pre-Christmas wind and rain storm the trails were in surprisingly good shape. Work party set for clearing what did come down impacting trails.
 - 5. Jellystone Issue
- a. Diana to request from DEP a copy of the plan they have and Lloyd to get a copy of the application the town has received.
- b. After reviewing those come up with some concerns and issues the CC would like consider at a Planning Board review or public meeting.
- c. Moratorium petition is almost completed.

Goals agreed upon. Some details will need to be worked out and specific wording will be needed. Documentation of agreement can be found in a

number of places. Each issue has just one place listed where it is documented. Initial thoughts on whether the agreements should be in the deed or a side agreement are noted in red.

- Pursuit of a transfer of title to KLT for \$1 and the Town's closing costs Original proposal. Never contested. Agreed in 8-29-22 KLT response (#1)
- Management for conservation, open space and low impact recreation Deed

Never contested. Agreed to in 8/29/22 KLT response. (#5)

- Keeping the property whole or adding to it Deed Agreed to in 8/29/22 KLT response (#6)
- KLT will make annual payments to the Town. Amount based on KLT's general policy. Deed

Agreed to in 8/29/22 KLT response (#7)

Protect water quality of Wilson Pond Deed

Agreed to in 8/29/22 KLT response (#8)

Limitations on structures Deed

Agreed to in 8/29/22 KLT response (#9)

- Provide public access via hiking trails Deed or Agreement?
 Agreed to in 8/29/22 KLT response (#10)
- Allow hunting with restrictions Deed or Agreement?
 Agreed to in 8/29/22 KLT response (#11)
- Motorized and mechanized public access limited to handicapped mobility devices and bicycles on an ADA accessible trail. Bicycle use to be restricted if there is user conflict orsafety issues. Deed Agreed to in 8/29/22 KLT response (#12), and 9/12/22 letter series.
- No commercial timber harvests. Potential for light management for views, hazard treeremoval, clearing trails, cleaning up windthrow and disease. Deed

Agreed to in 8/29/22 KLT response (#13)

- Advisory consultation with the Conservation Commission on significant issues. 5-year period. Benchmark progress by KLT during the 5 years include completion of a management plan and at least one loop trail completed. Agreement Agreed to in KLT letter of 5/9/22.
- Construction of an "easy" hiking trail in a location that could be used for a future ADA trail should funds be donated/become available. Agreement Agreed to in 8/29/22 KLT response. (#4)

Unclear about status of agreement.

• Trail(s) on the eastern/shore portion of the property Agreement KLT is concerned about a trail that crossed the "camp road" will invite vehicle use of that road. WCC feels strongly that the easter/shore portion of the property to be accessible to the public via a trail and believes that there are better ways to discourage public use of the road than by precluding having a trail that crosses it.

• Name of the property Agreement. KLT doesn't want "Wayne's" in the title.
